Richneck's Mission:

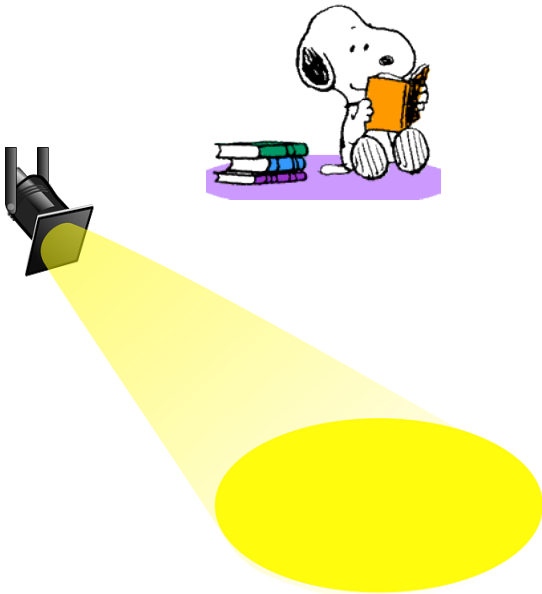
